RULES OF THE SHOW

1. Intending Exhibitors are requested to read the rules carefully and not to enter an exhibit unless they are prepared to comply with all Show regulations.
2. No entry will be accepted unless submitted on the official printed forms and accompanied by the full fee. Postal Orders / Cheques to be made payable to Athlone Agri-Show Festival.
3. All Certificates of Entry must be accurately filled in with every particular and signed by the exhibitor or agent. They must be lodged with / or sent by post to the Show Secretary together with the Entry Fee. Each exhibitor or agent must be prepared to verify every statement on the certificate of entry in any manner the Committee may require
4. All particulars required in the entry form must be full and accurately stated, otherwise the exhibitor is liable to be disqualified and may be excluded from the show.
5. An exhibitor may enter the same exhibit in more than one class in the animal section provided the necessary entry fee is paid in each class (unless otherwise stated).
6. The acceptance of an entry fee by Company will not be regarded as an admission that an exhibit is eligible to compete or receive an award.
7. The Committee reserves the right to refuse an entry without being liable for compensation and without the obligation to explain its decision.
8. Entries are accepted only on the understanding that there be no appeal beyond the Committee of the Show. The Committee's decision shall be final in any matter of dispute arising from or in connection with an entry for the show.
9. ***Persons entering an exhibit and failing to send same for exhibition will forfeit the entry fee. No refund of entry fees whatsoever.***
10. All exhibits must be bona fide property of the person in whose name the entry is made.
11. All stock is to be classified by age, which will be calculated from 1st January from the year of birth. The rules of the Royal Dublin Society as to detention shall be applied in the case of dispute as to age of horse, cattle or sheep.
12. Purebred Cattle means cattle entered for entry in the herd book of representative breeds. Pedigree name and tattoo number to be stated on the entry form and also in the case of bulls the number of the sire in the herd book and the breeding of the dam must be set out in the entry form.
13. Each exhibitor shall be solely responsible for any consequential or other loss, injury or damage done to or occasioned by or arising out of any animal or article exhibited by him or her for its description given in the catalogue and by entering indemnifies the Company against all legal and other proceedings in regard there to, howsoever arising.
14. Exhibitors will be held responsible for the behavior of their servants and agents and for the consequences of any miss-conduct of such servants or agents.
15. Neither the Company nor any of its officers, servants or agents shall damage ham or injury, howsoever arising to exhibitors or to their servants or agents, or to any exhibit or property into the showground.
16. A ring in the nose must properly secure each bull exhibited.

17. The Company reserve to itself the power to reject or cause to be removed any animal or exhibit from the Show Grounds without being held liable for compensation.
18. Exhibitors are to understand that, although every reasonable precaution will be taken to ensure the safety and welfare of any animal exhibited, the Committee will not be responsible for accidents of any kind that may occur. Neither will the Committee be whether exhibitor, spectator or otherwise.
19. Prize Colors: 1st Prize: Red; 2nd Prize: Blue; 3rd Prize: Yellow.
20. Prizes will be awarded in class where sufficient merit, but the Judges may withhold a prize where sufficient merit does not exist, the decision of the Judges will be final, except in the case s of fraud, misrepresentation, substitution or other breaches of the rules where the decision of the Executive Committee shall be final. Unless 3 entries are received no 2nd prize will be awarded, unless 5 entries are received no 3rd prize will be awarded in any one class in the horse and cattle section. In other sections, no 2nd prize unless there are 4 entries and 3rd prize unless there are 6 entries.
21. In the Livestock Section – any class for which only one entry is received will be cancelled.
22. All exhibits must bear their labels otherwise the stewards will refuse them.
23. Cattle will be unloaded / loaded in specially designated areas by their handler in the interest of safety.
24. All animals must conform to current regulations.
25. No exhibitor shall be permitted to enter the enclosure in which an entry is being judged unless he is in immediate charge of an exhibit himself. Any person infringing this rule will be disqualified from receiving any prizes in such classes unless such entry can be justified to the satisfaction of the Committee.
26. Judging will be carried out in accordance with classification and exhibitors are requested to have stock ready when called upon by the steward.
27. All prizes disallowed or not awarded belong to the Company.
28. No steward can officiate in a section if such steward is an exhibitor in the class under adjudication.
29. All animals in the horses and pony classes may be measured to provide the height before they receive their rosettes.
30. The Committee reserves the right to amalgamate classes if there are insufficient entries, without being responsible for compensation.
31. The Committee shall the power to disqualify any sheep, which is considered to be colored other than use, of ordinary non-bloom dips, free from other colored matter.
32. The Company reserves the right to postpone definitely or indefinitely without being responsible for compensation to exhibitors.
33. Persons awarded cups / trophies offered for competition at the Show shall deliver them to the Secretary in as good condition as they received them not later than one calendar month prior to the date of the next show.
34. Receipts must be signed for all Cups, Shields, or Statuettes awarded.
35. The Company reserves the right to refuse admission to the Show Grounds.

36. Should any matter arise not provided for in these rules and regulations it shall be referred to the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final and from which there shall be no appeal. Entries are only accepted on those conditions.
37. Objections: Any objection on points of disqualification etc to an award, must be lodged by an exhibitor in the class in which the award was made with the Secretary in writing, not later than 4.00 p.m. on day of the show accompanied by a fee of €10 for each objection. The fee or fees lodged will be forfeited in cases where the objection or objections is or are considered frivolous.

PLEASE NOTE IN THE INTEREST OF SAFETY ALL ANIMALS MUST BE HALTER LED, AND ATTENDED AT ALL TIMES BY A CAPABLE PERSON.

GENERAL RULES FOR IRISH SHOWS ASSOCIATION CHAMPIONSHIP 2011

A. ELIGIBILITY OF SHOWS

Shows wishing to participate in the 2011 Championship and be eligible to hold qualifiers must have collected the Championship Fund Levy (currently 5%) from Horse, Pony, Cattle and Sheep class prize money for the year 2010 and forwarded the amount so collected, in full to the Irish Shows Association Head Office within the stipulated period of not more than 30 days from the date of their show. Alternative methods of meeting this obligation are not acceptable.

Any show or competitor in the breach of the Rules set out below will be disqualified from participating or competing in these championships.

These General Rules and those relating to individual championships (where applicable) should be published in the show schedule and catalogue of the participating shows and must be strictly enforced.

B. QUALIFYING ROUNDS (QUALIFIERS)

Qualifying rounds will take place at eligible shows selected by the Irish Shows Association.

C. RESPONSIBILITY OF SHOWS HOLDING QUALIFYING ROUNDS

- A. Selected shows should hold a separate class for each qualifier from which the highest placed animal will qualify.
- B. The qualifier class should be held as the first (1st) class in the relevant section of the show.
- C. Shows must ensure that the qualifiers are held strictly in accordance with the relevant rules.
- D. No other sponsor may be involved in qualifying classes.

- E. Shows may charge an entrance fee for each qualifying class. **The I.S.A. will award a rosette to the successful animal(s) on appearance at the Final**
- F. **No show hosting a Championship Final may hold a qualifier for that championship on the day of the Final other than by agreement with the Irish Shows Association.**
- G. Animals qualified for Finals are **not** eligible to enter in any other class at the Show where the Final is held other than a Qualifying Class for another Competition.
- H. Shows **should** appoint competent well-briefed persons to act as Stewards, who must ensure that only animals (or other exhibits), which are eligible to compete, and those whose documentation is in order are allowed to proceed to the judging ring.
- I. Animal Passports must be read by a Veterinary Surgeon appointed by the show.
- J. On completion of judging, Stewards must instruct the successful competitors to attend at the Show Secretary's Office **within one hour** and to complete the necessary documentation for entry to the championship final.
- K. The show must appoint a well-briefed officer, who will be in attendance at the Secretary's Office, and who will assist exhibitors to complete the necessary documentation for participation in the final and to collect the relevant entry fee.
- L. **Show Secretaries must forward complete result cards, together with appropriate fees to the Irish Shows Association within three (3) days following the holding of the show.**
- N.B. Shows must return result cards marked "No Qualifier" for any or all of the events for which no animals (or exhibit) has been selected.**
- D. RESPONSIBILITY OF EXHIBITORS**
- A. Exhibitors accept that the Judges decision is final in all cases. Any abuse of Judges will not be tolerated. Where a dispute or case for complaint arises the matter should only be dealt with under f. below.
- B. **Winners of qualifiers are themselves responsible for entering their animals (or exhibits) for the final in accordance with j. and k. above, within one hour of qualifying.**
- C. Winners of qualifiers will compete in the final.
- D. The Irish Shows Association in conjunction with the sponsor reserves the right to alter or amend the rules of any competition as may be necessary or appropriate.
- E. **Shows and competitors must contact the I.S.A. for details of any championship and not the sponsor involved.**
- F. Objections must be lodged in writing with the I.S.A. representative at the show or the Show Secretary **within half an hour following the completion of the judging**, together with a fee of €50, or other stated fee, which is refundable in the event of the objection being upheld.
- E. RESPONSIBILITIES OF SHOWS HOSTING CHAMPIONSHIP FINALS**
- A. A deduction of 5% of the prize money is to be collected by the show and forwarded to the Irish Shows Association within **30 Days of the final.**
- B. Championship finals must start **not later than 2pm on the day of the show** and the advertised time of starting must be adhered to as far as practicable. If necessary, other show classes should be either postponed or relocated to allow for this.

NOTICES OF INTEREST TO CHAMPIONSHIP PARTICIPANTS

IRISH LAW(EU DIRECTIVE)

Under Irish Law their passports must accompany all horses moving from one location to another. It is in your own interest to ensure this is the case. Failure to do so is an offence under Irish Law and is liable to on summary conviction to result in a fine up to €3000. All passports must be registered with the name of the current owner.

- **Embryo Transfer:** Where a foal is produced by this method the dams passport must bear a declaration dated, stamped and signed by the stallion owner (or accredited practitioner where AI is involved) stating the date on which the dam was last covered (or inseminated) and the name of the covering stallion.
- The owners of Champions and Reserve Champions are invited to submit the animal's passport to the I.S.A. head office where the placing will be endorsed and officially stamped with the seal of the Irish Shows Association as a permanent record.
- It is in the interest of shows hoisting championship finals that photographs and results are forwarded to the Irish Farmers Journal immediately following judging.

Safety at the Show

We all want to have a successful, enjoyable day, but most importantly a safe and accident free one. To ensure this, co-operation of all is vital including exhibitors, spectators and organizers.

- Few guidelines to note in relation to safety as follows:
- Please observe signs- especially those relating to caution in livestock areas etc.
- Please do not exhibit animals that are hard to control or acting in a dangerous manner.
- All animals must be led by a competent adult.
- Animals must not be tied to trailers.
- Dogs must be on a lead at all times and under control of their handler.
- Caution and care should be exercised at all times.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR ORGANISERS OF AND EXHIBITORS AT LIVESTOCK SHOWS, 2011

GENERAL

Show organisers should notify the SVI at their local DVO of the intention to hold a show and provide the location and proposed dates of the show. **Keeper herd numbers for Agricultural Shows must be obtained in advance from NBAS Division, Back Weston Campus, Back Weston, Celbridge, Co Kildare - Telephone (01) 5058600.**

Exhibitors should apply in good time to the Show Secretary to check any requirements specific to that show.

CODE OF PRACTICE – BIOSECURITY

Livestock Marts, Meat Plants, Showground's, Co-operatives, Agricultural Premises

In general movement and mixing of animals presents the greatest risk of the spread of most animal diseases. For that reason the operators of marts, meat plants, livestock shows etc., have a key role to play in ensuring that the disease risks associated with their premises and operations are kept to a minimum. Specific legal requirements apply in relation to bio-security arrangements. Adherence to these bio-security arrangements and the guidelines outlined below can have a significant impact on reducing the opportunities for disease transmission.

Acceptance of animals

- Deal with registered animal keepers only.
- Under no circumstances should animals that are identified improperly or documented improperly be accepted.

Cleaning / disinfections

- All areas where animals have been in contact should be washed down thoroughly and disinfected with an approved disinfectant at the end of each day at a minimum.
- Keep drinking/feeding troughs clean and free of animal waste material.

- **Cleaning and disinfections facilities should be available on site for all transport vehicles delivering/collecting animals. Shows should enforce the use of these cleaning and disinfections facilities at all times.**
- **Ensure that clients, when visiting the premises, wear waterproof footwear (e.g. Wellington boots) that can be cleaned and disinfected easily.**
- **Provide footbaths with suitable approved disinfectant at appropriate locations on the premises.**
- **Provide facilities for hand washing with liquid soap and for washing down footwear.**
- **Provide signs on premises reminding people of the need to minimize the risks of disease transmission and the availability on-site of washing facilities for vehicles and persons.**

Identification, documentation and record keeping

- **Retain a record of the registration number of each vehicle delivering/collecting each consignment of animals.**
- **Maintain a register, in readily accessible form, of all vendors/buyers, including numbers and types of animals involved in each transaction.**
- **Ensure compliance with all requirements in relation to record keeping and retention of records.**
- **Forward completed CMMS 4s to the local District Veterinary Office to ensure that the cattle movement details are recorded on the Animal Identification and Movement (AIM) database.**

Suspicious/unusual transactions or movements

- **Report any suspicious or unusual transactions or movements involving livestock to the Department of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food or the Garda Siochana (such information can be provided on a strictly confidential basis).**

SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS - CATTLE

Animal Health Status

T.B.

All animals must come from herds, which are not restricted, and the herd and relevant animals must have had a clear test within the previous twelve months. No pre-movement test is required for T.B. However, it is recommended by the Department that a 30-day pre-movement test for TB should apply to all Shows.

Brucellosis

- (a) All animals must come from herds which are not restricted.
- (b) **Certain animals (i.e. females aged 18 months and over and bulls aged 24 months and over) must have passed a test for Brucellosis within the previous 60 days. However, these animals may move to any number of Shows within the validity period of the same 60-day pre-movement test.**

Where such an animal(s) is/are being shown repeatedly during successive 60-day validity periods, in the course of a Show season, the animal(s) may be allowed to move on foot of Permit ER 36A during the unexpired portion of a valid test where the animal is under test for the next validity period and the identity card/passport is held by the DVO/practitioner.

Identification

All cattle must bear double plastic tags as issued under the Department's identification system. They must be accompanied by their passports (except in the circumstances outlined in the preceding sub-paragraph).

Bulls for A.I. Stations

In addition to the T.B. and Brucellosis tests, bulls destined for A.I. stations must be tested for I.B.R. (Infectious Bovine Rhynotracheitis), E.B.L. (Enzootic Bovine Leukosis), B.V.D. (Bovine Virus Diarrhoea) and Johnes Disease, within 30 days prior to movement into such stations.

AIM Notification

The movement of Irish-registered cattle to and from an Agricultural Show within the State must be recorded on AIM using form CMMS 4 (available from local DVOs). Ultimate responsibility for fulfilling this requirement lies with the Show Secretary.

The keeper of the animal(s) should complete sections 2 and 3(a) of the CMMS 4 form while Section 3(b) should be completed by the Show Secretary. Completed forms should be sent to the District Veterinary Office in the county where the Show is being held within 7 days of movement.

Imports from Northern Ireland

It is very important that any proposal to import cattle to a show is made known to the local District Veterinary Office well in advance so that consideration can be given to compliance with the requirements outlined below.

Premises

The Show premises at which the cattle will reside for the duration of their stay must either be an assembly centre approved for exports or of such a standard as being capable of being approved for such a purpose temporarily. A fundamental requirement for such premises is that they have surfaces that are capable of being cleaned and disinfected, and have adequate cleaning and disinfection facilities. Adequate segregation facilities may be required also (see under "Status of Animals" below).

Status of Animals

Cattle from Northern Ireland being moved to a show must be certified in accordance with the normal requirements for intra-community trade in breeding animals including having passed a TB test (export interpretation) during the 30 days prior to export and a brucellosis test in the case of eligible animals (females and entire males over 12 months) during the 30 days prior to leaving the herd of origin.

To comply with eligibility requirements for re-importation into Northern Ireland after the show, cattle must not mix with any cattle of a lesser health status whilst at the show. This can be achieved in one of two ways: (i) either the imported animals are kept segregated fully from other cattle at the show which have not been tested, or (ii) all cattle attending the show must have been TB (export interpretation) within 30 days and all cattle from Northern Ireland attending the show must have been brucellosis tested within 30 days as set out above.

Documentation

Cattle imported to a show from Northern Ireland must be accompanied by an original breeding animal intra-trade health certificate (known as a TRACES certificate) and a passport for each animal. . For the return journey, this original certificate must be endorsed by the signature of the official veterinarian of the Department at the show, together with the official stamp of the competent authority and date of endorsement. A TRACES message will be sent for the return journey also (this will be performed by Department officials attending the show).

In addition, a non-comminglement certificate must be issued by the official veterinarian for the show at or before return, stating that the animal shows no clinical signs of disease and has not been in contact, during its stay at the show/event, with animals of a lesser health status. The passport must accompany the animal on the return journey also.

The Show Secretary should complete a CMMS 5 form in respect of animals imported to take part in the Show. The owner of the imported animal(s) is required to sign the form also when the animal arrives at the Show and provide his/her herd number. Following the Show, the official veterinarian should complete the bottom portion of the CMMS 5 form also confirming that he has stamped the official Health Certificate and that he has issued a Non-Comminglement Certificate.

The completed CMMS 5 form should then be forwarded to NBAS Division, Administration Building, Backweston Campus, Backweston, Celbridge, Co Kildare to enable recording of the movement. A carbon copy of the form will be provided for the Show Secretary, the official veterinarian and the herd keeper of the animal(s).

CMMS 5 forms are available from local District Veterinary Offices (DVOs) or from the Cattle Movement Notification Agency, Clonakilty, Co Cork.

Exports to Northern Ireland

The movement of Irish-registered cattle to a Show in Northern Ireland must be recorded on AIM. When the intra-trade Certificate is being issued by the local office, they will arrange to have the export movement of the animal(s) recorded onto AIM. All cattle must be accompanied by an official TRACES intra-trade certificate for bovine animals. A TRACES message, corresponding with the TRACES certificate, will be sent for each animal or consignment being dispatched to the show (this will be performed by Department officials in the DVO).

Export of cattle to an agricultural show within the EU other than to Northern Ireland

Agreement for the movement and immediate return of cattle to a Show in another country or vice versa currently applies for movements between Ireland and Northern Ireland only – it does not apply for movements to Great Britain or further afield. Requests for Irish-registered cattle to attend shows in countries other than Northern Ireland, will be dealt with on a case-by-case basis.

Before the movement of Irish-registered cattle to a Show in parts of the EU other than to Northern Ireland takes place, it is imperative to establish that the competent authority of the destination country has agreed to put in place the same system for the processing of the documentation as applies to exports to Northern Ireland.

Therefore exhibitors who wish to show cattle at an EU Show other than in Northern Ireland should contact the local District Veterinary Office (DVO) at least one month prior to the Show.

Where the export of Irish-registered cattle is agreed with the destination country, the movement of Irish-registered cattle must be recorded on AIM. When the official intra-trade Certificate for bovine animals is being issued by the local office, they will arrange to have the export movement of the animal(s) recorded onto AIM.

Following the show, the original Health Certificate is endorsed and stamped by the official veterinarian at the Show and a non-Comminglement certificate will be issued also.

When the animal returns to the home farm, the keeper presents these Certificates to the DVO along with a completed CMMS 6 form (available at DVOs) stating that the animal has returned from the show. The DVO can record the import movement back to the keeper's holding on the AIM system then.

All sheep must be identified individually with appropriate ear tags issued in accordance with the requirements of the National Sheep Identification System (NSIS).

Movement Documentation

All consignments of sheep being moved must be accompanied by a completed dispatch document. Individual details of each sheep in the consignment must be recorded on the document. Sheep from non-restricted flocks only can be moved to shows. In the case of flocks restricted following diagnosis of scrapie, sheep possessing the ARR/ARR genotype only may be exhibited.

A TRACES message, corresponding with the TRACES certificate, will be sent for each animal or consignment being dispatched to the show (this will be performed by officials in the dispatching country)[1].

The movement of these ARR/ARR genotype sheep must be accompanied by the relevant movement permit (SCR/10), which can be obtained from the local District Veterinary Office in the county where the flock is located.

Flock Register

All movements of sheep to and from shows must be recorded in the keeper's flock register.

Exports to Northern Ireland

All sheep must be accompanied by a TRACES intra trade certificate for ovine

animals. A TRACES message, corresponding with the TRACES certificate, will be sent for each animal or consignment being dispatched to the show (this will be performed by Department officials of the DVO). Exhibitors are advised to contact the show society in Northern Ireland well in advance of any show to determine the suitability of the show for return of animals (e.g. premises and sheep status), and whether the authorities will have officials and veterinary staff present to supervise and process documentation for animals returning to origin.

Agreement for the movement and immediate return of sheep to a Show in another country or vice versa currently applies for movements between Ireland and Northern Ireland only – it does not apply for movements to Great Britain or further afield. Movements to shows other than Northern Ireland, will be dealt with on a case-by-case basis and you should contact your local District Veterinary Office at least one month prior to the Show.
